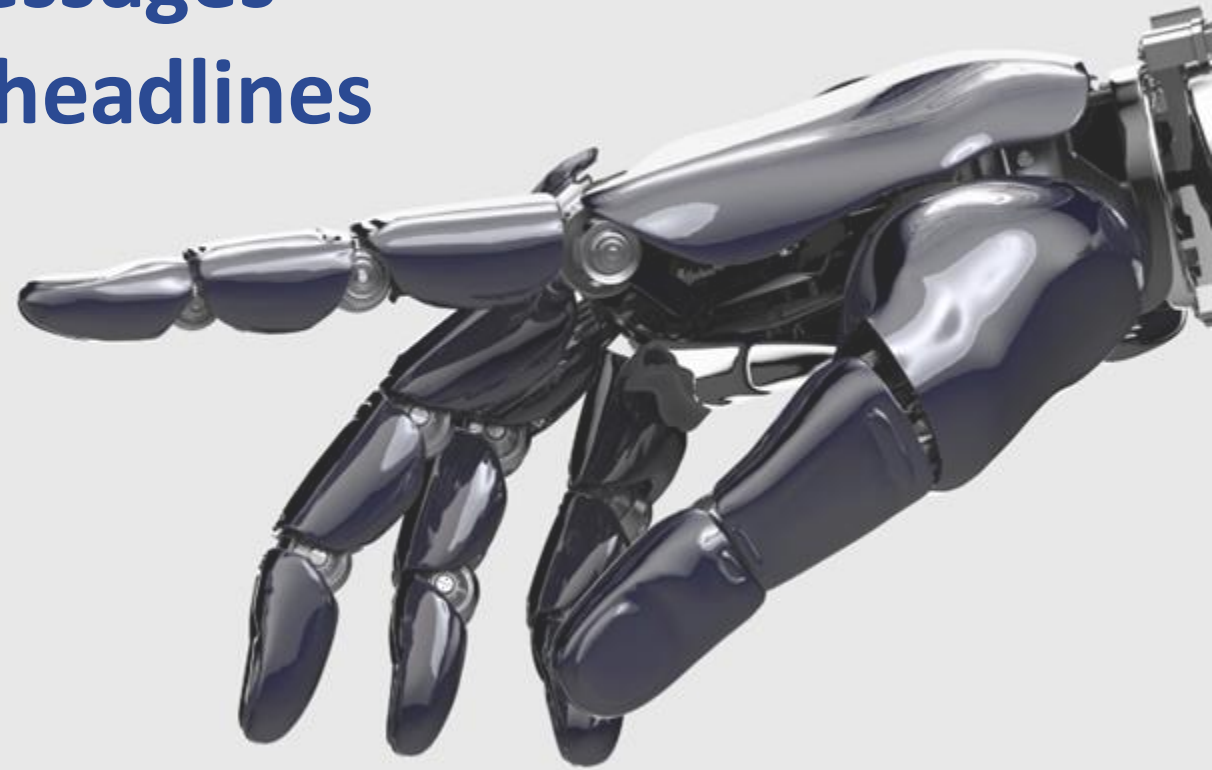
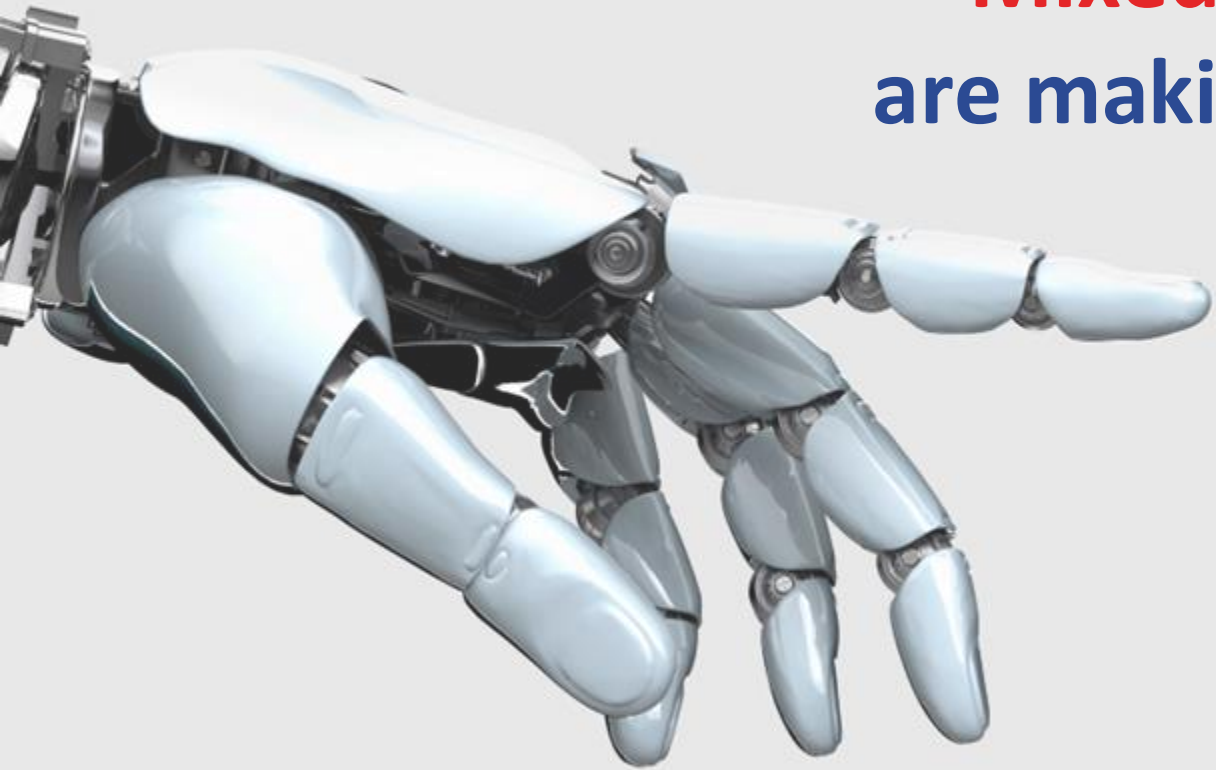

Mixed messages are making headlines



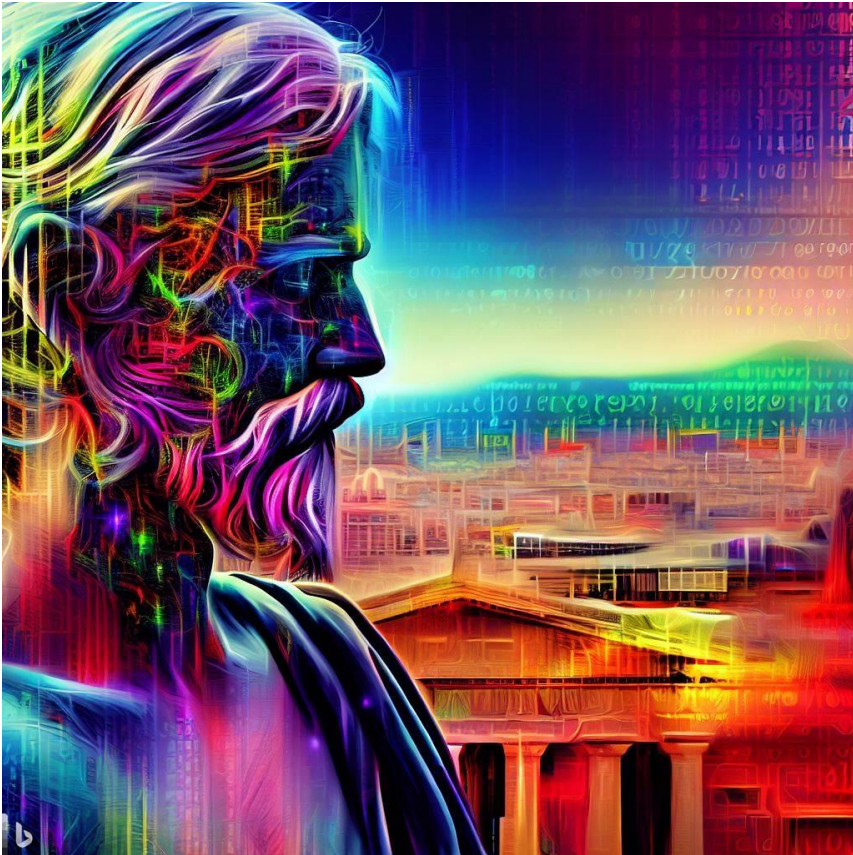

- Will AI revolutionise education?
- Is it the perfect student and teacher assistant?
- Does it signal the end of human intelligence?
- Will people stop learning languages?
- Will teachers lose their jobs?



Are we asking the right questions?

The impact **depends** on our

choices

It's not just about the technology,
it's about *why* & *how* we use it.

We need to **shift** the conversation



What AI tools should I use?

How can I enhance my pedagogy?

How can AI work *for* me, not *against* me?

What precautions should I take with AI?

As educators our role is complex

We need to create opportunities for students to learn in new and dynamic ways

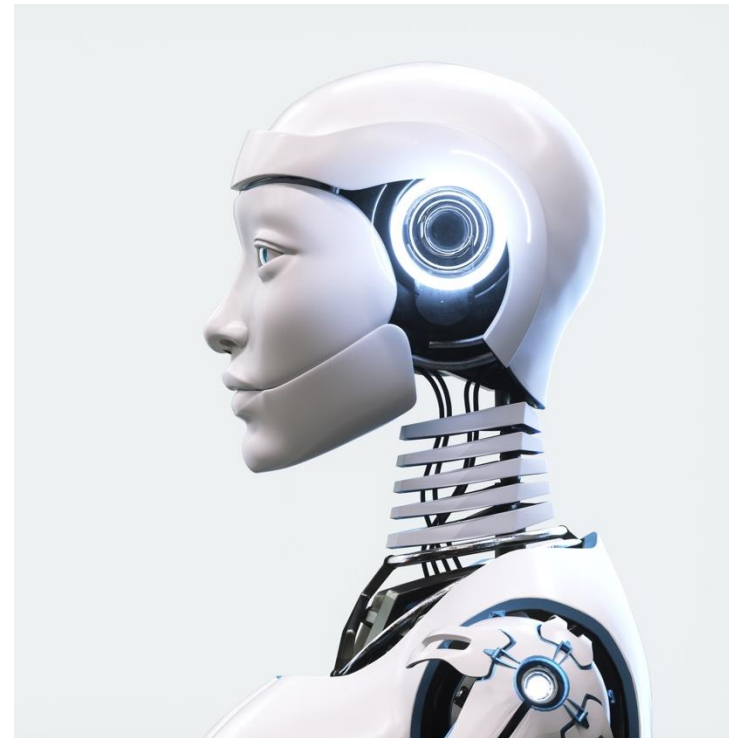

In what way will this enhance my pedagogy?

- Multimedia learning
- Language practice & revision
- Fun & game-based learning
- Efficiency for the teacher (more quality in less time)

Closing remarks: 5 key take-aways

Pedagogy first

Always start by asking:

What do I want my students to learn?

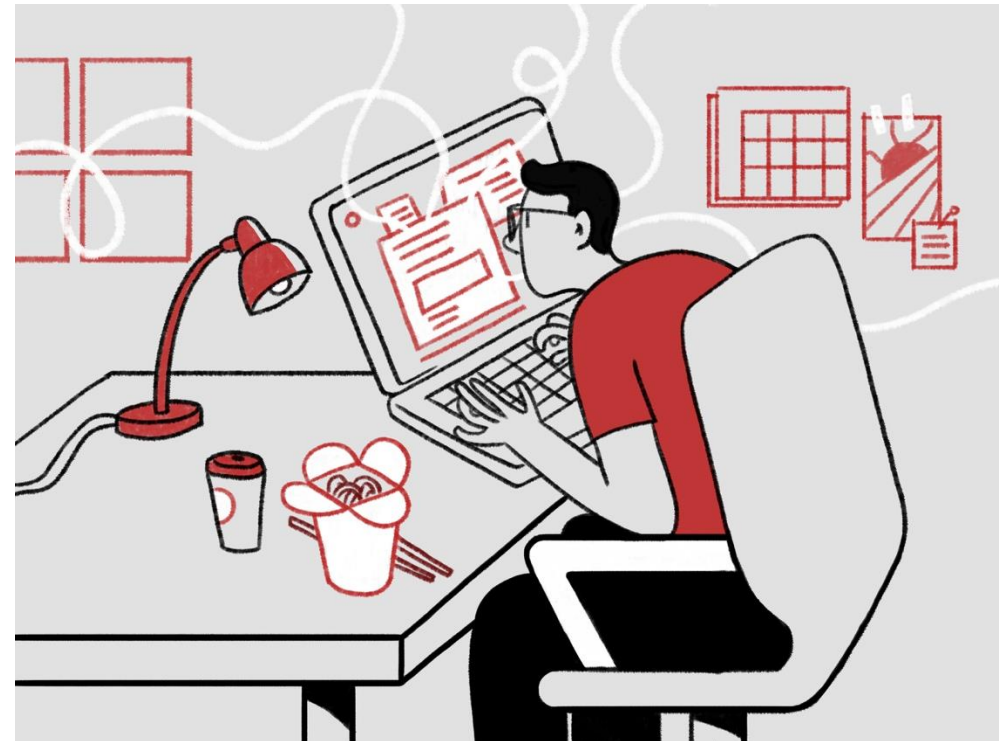
Then ask:

What tools can I use for this?



Practise hands-on

- There is a digital handout with step-by-step guidance; text, images & videos.
- BUT be prepared to learn through trial and error.
- Technology is something we *do*, not just something we *understand*. The theoretical part is very important, but we must try it to know how to use it.



Technologies are **NOT** static

- They evolve
- Features change; they may be free but become paid later
- We need to always look beyond the tool. Tools can be replaced.



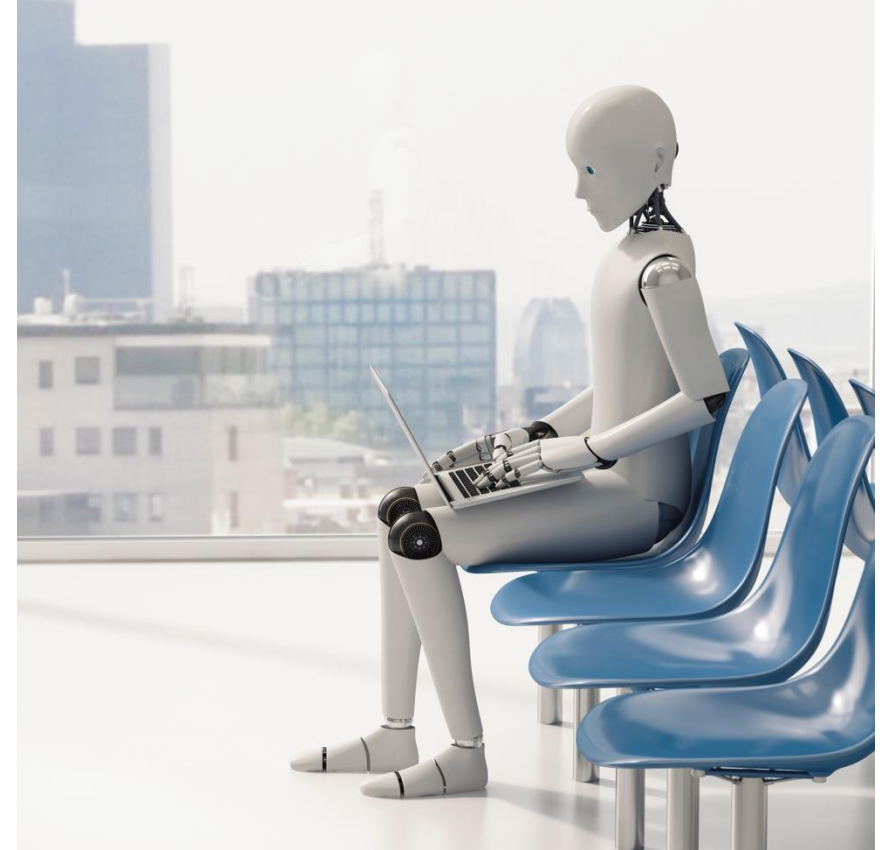
Free or **paid** technologies?



- Paid tools have more features, better privacy settings and no ads.
- BUT, always start from the free option. Try it; check if it's user-friendly and useful for your context.
- Invest in a paid subscription—you or your school—once you have evaluated the tool.
- Give some time to train students as well.

Will teachers be **replaced** by AI?

- **Absolutely not.** Teachers are irreplaceable. AI could never be a substitute for teachers' professional judgement and the personal relationship they have with their pupils.
- **Stay in charge.** Always have the final say when using AI in your teaching practices.
- **Review and adapt.** Even if AI helps create activities, always review, edit, and adjust them to meet your students' needs.
- AI in education relies on **your expertise** and active involvement as a teacher.
